MORNING HEALTH CHECK



Signs to Observe:

- General mood and changes in behavior
- · Fever or elevated body temperature
- Skin rashes, unusual spots, swelling or bruises
- Complaints of pain and not feeling well
- Signs/symptoms of disease (severe coughing, sneezing, breathing difficulties, discharge from nose, ears or eyes, diarrhea, vomiting etc.)
- Reported illness in child or family members

Use all of your senses . . .

- LOOK for signs
- **LISTEN** for complaints
- FEEL for fever
- SMELL for unusual odo

Learning Begins at Home

Oral Language Activities... Read holiday books together, Play & act out Little Jack Horner, Mary had a Little Lamb or your favorite nursery rhyme, Look at calendar & talk about what you did yesterday, today & tomorrow, sing holiday songs & explain language "new" words. Cut a triangle out and have child follow directions "put triangle under/over/off/on/beside, etc" an object., name colors in a room

Establishing routines Set table & count each plate/cup/utensil, practice dressing/undressing, outside clothes too, don't forget the zipper, brush teeth & discuss each step & why its important

Motor Activities Use toothpicks/mini marshmallows to build shapes, letters or structures, walk while snowing & count snowflakes you can catch, dance to holiday music, punch holes in greeting cards and string on yarn to hang up, write thank you cards, string jingle bells & sing & dance, build a snowman(snow, boxes, stuffed bags), talk about small medium & large.

Play at home... make holiday cookies together, holiday light drive, board game night, make play do & make "cookies"
